February 2026 Speaker

Jerry G. Bryant, Lt. Col. USAF (Ret.)

Jerry's 23-year military career included three overseas assignments and tours of duty as a C-130 pilot and C-12 instructor pilot. He served as Assistant Air Attaché at the U.S. Embassy in Ankara, Turkey and later commanded the 435th Operations Support Squadron at Rhein Main Air Base, Germany. While in Germany he flew numerous relief missions in Bosnia and led extended deployments to Angola and Croatia. Bryant completed his military career as a faculty member at the Defense Intelligence Agency's Joint Military Attaché School. He's a graduate of the Naval Postgraduate School and the Defense Language Institute.

After retiring from the Air Force, he served for 11 years as Vice President of RTCA, Inc., an aviation standards organization in Washington D.C. The organization develops technical standards for FAA regulatory guidance and policy recommendations for modernizing the National Airspace System. In 2008 he became Chief of Staff for a satellite acquisition program to serve DOD, NASA, and NOAA requirements. He is now retired and currently serves as the Flight Captain of the Old Pueblo Daedalian Flight in Tucson.
